Earn a CLAD-CTEL Authorization from UCR Extension, and provide effective learning tools and skills for English Learners.

The CLAD-CTEL Authorization is designed to meet the English Learner (EL) Authorization academic requirements of the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) for training teachers in the methods of language development and academic instruction to benefit English Learners. UCR Extension is proud to offer several options to earn the CLAD through CTEL Authorization including the “Blended” option. In the past, teachers were required to pass ALL subtests of the CTEL exam or complete ALL of the required coursework to become certified; however, recent changes to the program have made it possible to combine passing CTEL exam subtests with UCR coursework in an effort to accommodate varying situations of teaching professionals.

It’s our responsibility as teachers and mentors to be as knowledgeable and prepared for the educational needs of all students so that they can have a positive learning outcome. Earn a CLAD-CTEL Authorization and be the bridge that helps connect English Learners to a promising future!

WHAT YOU’LL LEARN

- The relationship between culture/cultural diversity and academic achievement/development
- Language systems, forms and functions, and factors that impact second language development
- Effective assessment tools and strategies for English Learners
- Second language acquisition and methods for academic content instruction

ADMISSION

A Bachelor’s degree from an accredited institution is required. A minimum grade point average of 3.0 is required.

This program is open to teachers who hold a valid California teaching credential, Speech-Language Pathology or Clinical or Rehabilitative Services Credential with a Special Class Authorization, School Nurse Services Credential with a Special Teaching Authorization in Health, Visiting Faculty Permit, Children’s Center Permit (excluding emergency), or Child Development Permit (excluding Assistant and Associate Permit) that authorizes the holder to provide instruction to pupils.

HOW TO EARN THIS PROFESSIONAL AUTHORIZATION:

Individuals must participate in an orientation session and complete a minimum of 18 quarter units, with a grade “B” or better.*
